### PUBLIC HEARING FOR OAKVIEW ZONING BY-LAW

Beat Gamper had a presentation that was read at the hearing by the C.A.O. on his behalf which outlined several changes that he would like made to the zoning by-law before it is given second reading by Council. The presenter requested that council close loop holes in the zoning by-law that my negatively affect water quality; quality of life; and ratepayers in the municipality.

Ruth Pryzner; Laura Neely-Carter; and Lois Hyndman also requested that changes be made in the zoning by-law to protect our land, water; and quality of life for the ratepayers.

1. Notice of Motion re: G. Bos request to dig through roads for water project.

Motion: L. van Veen – Walt Froese

#316/19: Whereas a notice of motion was received to rescind Resolution #260/19 which

indicated that:

"Whereas Bos Family Farms is working on a water pipeline project for newly established pastureland on the N ½ of 3-14-20W; N ½ of 2-14-20W; and the W ½ of 10-14-20W and has requested permission to plough a shallow buried waterline to supply water for livestock on each quarter;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the R.M. of Oakview authorizes Bos Family Farms to bore through Municipal Road 79N between Roads 116W and 117W and Road 116W between 79N and 78N to install a four inch poly sleeve under the road to pull a 2 inch waterline through and to provide electric fence power to the W ½ of 10-14-20W and N ½ of 2-14-20W with the following conditions:

- 1) That all water lines be bored through municipal roads and done in consultation with our public works department so that the roads are left in a safe condition;
- 2) That required signage be used and all Workplace Safety and Health requirements be adhered to

And whereas further information was received regarding costs to ratepayers to bore water lines through municipal roads;

Therefore, be it resolved that Council agree to rescind Resolution #260/19 passed on June 11<sup>th</sup>, 2019.

#317/19: Whereas Bos Family Farms is working on a water pipeline project for newly

established pastureland on the N  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 3-14-20W; N  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 2-14-20W; and the W  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 10-14-20W and has requested permission to plough a shallow buried waterline to supply water for livestock on each quarter;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the R.M. of Oakview authorizes Bos Family Farms to dig through Municipal Road 79N between Roads 116W and 117W and Road 116W between 79N and 78N to install a four inch poly sleeve in the road to put in a 2 inch waterline through and to provide electric fence power to the W  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 10-14-20W and N  $\frac{1}{2}$  of 2-14-20W with the following conditions:

- 1) That all trenching through municipal roads be done in consultation with our public works department so that the road is left in a safe condition;
- 2) That any additional gravel or maintenance required in the excavation site and applied by the municipality would be billed to the ratepayer for up to two years after the excavation:
- 3) That required signage be used and all Workplace Safety and Health requirements be adhered to
- 4) That the ratepayer be required to obtain any necessary permits and identify the location of the lines in the road allowance

Municipality of Oakview respecting Rapid City Water System Upgrades has been

received;

And whereas the project is estimated to be \$120,000.00 with the R.M. of Oakview required to pay \$60,000.00 And the Province to provide a grant of \$60,000.00; And whereas borrowing by-law No. 2016-3 was passed in June 2016 which

authorized the R.M. to borrow \$90,000.00 and the debenture has not been issued to

date as all the work was not completed;

Therefore, be it resolved that the Council of the R.M. of Oakview authorize the Reeve and C.A.O. to sign the agreement with The Manitoba Water Services Board and that the local share of the project will be repaid by borrowing and by the gas tax

reserve fund.

Manitoba Sustainable Development.
