The Province's Education Review Commission has been tasked with proposing a renewed vision for K-12 education in Manitoba. The Commission intends on making "bold recommendations to ignite change" within the existing systems and programs that will inspire excellence in teaching and learning. Amalgamations of the 37 elected school boards in our province may be considered. This may mean local communities will have less of a voice in their students' education.

The nine member commission appointed by the Province to review K-12 education in Manitoba recently announced the plan for public consultation.
